BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Alan McCulloch Drummond was a native of River Forest, Illinois. He received his B.A. from the University of Wisconsin and his M.D. from Northwestern University Medical School. He interned at Cook County General Hospital in Chicago and served residencies at both the Menninger Clinic in Topeka, Kansas and at St. Elizabeths Hospital in Washington, DC.

Dr. Drummond was a member of the American Academy of Psychoanalysis, the American Psychiatric Association, and several other psychiatric and psychoanalytic societies. Dr. Drummond practiced in Santa Fe, New Mexico from 1946 to 1950 where he founded and directed the Santa Fe Mental Health Clinic. From 1950 to 1972, Dr. Drummond practiced in Washington, DC.

SCOPE AND CONTENTS

The papers of Alan M. Drummond housed in the Archives of the American Psychiatric Association came from his wife, Dorothy Drummond, in 1974. These papers are exclusively patient materials from the Peking Union Medical College Hospital. They include patient records, clinical notes, and patient art work gathered from Chinese patients at the Peking Union Medical College Hospital between 1933 and 1936. The collection totals 1.5 linear feet and has only one series: patient records.
